We are proud to introduce the Energy UK Young Energy Professionals Forum Annual Report for 2023. The past year has seen the Forum go from strength to strength, with now over 2,300 members, and we can't wait to see what 2024 holds.

Now that we approach the end of our tenure as Chair and Vice-Chair, it is time to reflect on the achievements of the YEP Forum this past year.

As the transition to Net Zero intensifies, we decided to focus our set piece publication of 2023 on skills, with our Guide to Jobs in Energy. This resource offers a rich overview of the different type of jobs in the energy sector and where they are located. It provides deep insight into the day-to-day activities of life in the sector through a broad range of profiles of people working across all parts of the sector from offshore wind engineers through to desk-based data roles in the city.

In the midst of the cost-of-living crisis, we have been proud to support the Fuel Bank Foundation in its efforts to ensure that those in need receive financial and practical support during these difficult times. Building on the partnership with the Fuel Bank Foundation was one of the Forum's key objectives for 2023 and we are pleased to announce we have raised almost £2,000 through donations. ### Site Visit: National Grid ESO Control Room

Later in March (31st), the YEPs headed to Wokingham to visit National Grid ESO's Electricity National Control Centre and tour the Control Room. Over the course of the day, we heard from policy experts from across the ESO on a range of topics, from the balancing programme to offshore network design and the challenges facing system operators. We also heard first-hand what a day in the life of a Control Room engineer. Looks like as they work around the clock to make sure that the right amount of electricity gets to where it's needed, when it's needed.



# YEP Forum x KPMG Leaders 2050: Closing the Skills Gap for Net Zero

In April, the YEP Forum collaborated with KMPG's Leaders 2050 and National Grid to deliver a "speed breakout" event. Members had the opportunity to discuss key skills-related subjects with senior leaders and consider how every profession within the industry can contribute to Net Zero.

We were welcomed to National Grid's Strand office by its Senior Public Affairs Manager, Scott Couldridge, whose keynote speech stressed the importance of having a diverse set of people – with their skills, experience, and interests – working in energy and propelling Britain towards a Net Zero future.

By cycling through 10-minute breakout groups with different leaders, members then had the chance to discuss a particular subject with the energy leader. Guiding questions for conversation included: "Why is your skill/profession important to delivering Net Zero?", "How can we ensure jobs in energy are accessible to under-represented groups and disadvantaged communities?" and "What are the key skills gaps that need to be filled to deliver Net Zero?".

With such a diverse range of leaders and members the ensuing conversations were vibrant, informed, and thought-provoking. Members really appreciated the opportunity to have a more interactive and personal conversation about energy – and their role in it both now and in the future – alongside not just peers, but energy leaders in roles they one day aspire to be in themselves.

# Site Visit: Dogger Bank Operations and Maintenance Base

In June, the YEPs travelled from across the UK to Newcastle, specifically the Port of Tyne in South Shields to visit the Dogger Bank Operation and Maintenance (O&M) Base. This is where Dogger Bank Wind Farm, which when complete will be the biggest offshore wind farm in the world, is set to be operated. The wind farm is located more than 130km off the northeast coast of England and is being delivered by joint venture partners SSE Renewables, Equinor and Vårgrønn. Mark Halliday, Vice President of O&M, and Tom Nightingale, North East Stakeholder Manager (at the time), showed us how Dogger Bank is set to operate including showing us the control room where they can manage the operation of the wind farm with over 30,000 sensors.

We also visited the Port of Tyne and saw how it is transitioning from a predominately coal and shipping port, towards a Net Zero port.







# **Summer Parliamentary Reception**

In June 2023, the YEP Forum held its first-ever Parliamentary Reception, hosted by PRASEG and sponsored by Octopus Energy. Held in the Churchill Room, we heard from leading voices across Parliament and industry on both UK and global progress toward Net Zero. # YEP Forum Site Visit: Rampion Offshore Wind Farm, Brighton

In August, the YEPs travelled to the UK's south coast, near Brighton, to visit RWE's Rampion Offshore Wind Farm. After boarding a boat to reach the site, the YEPs enjoyed a guided tour which provided an insight into the engineering behind the structures, highlighted their environmental benefits and contribution to reducing carbon emissions.

The tour enabled the YEPs to witness the interplay between nature and technology, as the turbines coexist with the marine environment. The experience offered a unique perspective on the challenges and triumphs of renewable energy initiatives as we transition towards cleaner, more sustainable energy sources. Moreover, the educational aspect of the tour provided valuable insights into the future of energy production and the role that offshore wind farms play in combating climate change.







# YEP Forum x CRA: EV Charging - the Present and Future of a Growing Sector

As the electrification of transport advances, electric vehicle (EV) charging infrastructure must be deployed alongside the vehicles themselves to help support the mass adoption of this technology. At the same time, there is an increasingly diverse mix of EV drivers with differing charging preferences, meaning charging providers are challenged to satisfy these different charging needs. YEP Forum partnered with Charles River Associates (CRA) in September on a panel to discuss these challenges. Managing Director of Transport Team, Sumitomo Mitsui Banking Corporation The panel discussed the state of the EV charging industry, touching upon major roadblocks to the sector's development going forward. The discussion centred on the role played by each stakeholder within the EV charging ecosystem, stressing the importance of coordination between different parties to enhance the electrification of road transport. Involving speakers from different parts of the EV charging space, including companies in the financial, charging and original equipment manufacturer (OEM) segments, the conversation touched upon the relevance of combining public and private funding to advance the shift to electric. There was agreement that the sector is quickly developing and uncertainty around EV drivers' charging preferences remains as we move into the mass adoption of EVs. Overall, there was widespread consensus on the sector's positive outlook, with confidence that electric mobility will be a key enabler of decarbonisation and it could enhance the energy system's flexibility.



# Site Visit: Aldborough Gas Storage Visit



In October, the YEP Forum visited SSE's Thermal's Aldborough Gas Storage site; as sponsor for the Forum, this is another example of its commitment to fostering talent within the energy industry.

An informal buffet lunch allowed attendees to mix and interact, setting the tone for meaningful discussions throughout the day. Industry experts took the stage, delivering a series of insightful presentations. Gas Storage Director, Michael Gillat, offered a comprehensive overview of gas storage, highlighting its strategic significance within the company and outlining future plans. Process Safety Engineer, Matt Trindall, delved into the nuanced safety considerations specific to gas storage plants, shedding light on the intricacies of working within a Control of Major Accident Hazards (COMAH) site. Hydrogen Technology Engineer, Oliver Wilson, provided valuable insights into the evolving landscape of hydrogen production, storage, and utilisation in the energy sector.

Following these enriching presentations, attendees were led on a comprehensive site tour.

The visit was a memorable and educational experience for all, with great feedback from attendees.

# YEP Forum x Accenture Data and digital: Accelerating the Net Zero transition, Edinburgh

In November 2023, the YEP Forum partnered with Accenture to host its first event in Scotland post-Covid. 

# In October 2023, we released our updated Guide to Jobs in Energy.

The report featured interviews and insights with almost 20 people from various roles across the energy sector, exploring how they got into the sector, their current role, what skills are important, what advice they would give and their outlook and aspirations for the sector moving forward.

The guide aims to inspire people to join the sector, through driving awareness about the diversity of careers available and the different pathways to entry. It covers technical roles in engineering and STEM fields, as well as innovation, policy influencing, and organisations that provide a service to the sector. The guide was shared with targeted stakeholders and was well received and featured on careers websites and university career departments. It was widely shared on social media with 45 reshares and over 12,000 impressions.

# Emma Pinchbeck, Chief Executive of Energy UK said:

"The energy industry will play a vital role in helping the UK decarbonise and yet it is well documented that there is a skills gap that could be detrimental to achieving our Net Zero target. "Hundreds of thousands of new jobs need to be filled by 2050 and there is a need for people who understand communications, marketing, or have commercial skills, alongside people who can invent things and solve technical issues.

"It's important that people from all backgrounds can see themselves working in our sector, and this guide, as well as the wider work of the YEP Forum, will help people at the start of their working life understand how they can have a long-term career with purpose."

"The transition to Net Zero will require a monumental effort from hundreds of thousands of people to deliver all the new infrastructure we need and solve the challenges ahead of us with innovative ideas. 











